## Visual of the new SEN building

Welcome to the first edition of Midas Construction newsletter.

These communications will be distributed monthly to help keep you informed on progress for the project and as our neighbour during the construction phase what you expect to see on site. ### The Project

As a high-profile contractor in the Southwest, we bring a wealth of experience to this scheme providing the school with high quality regeneration of the existing school. The project comprises of the construction of new purpose built SEN classrooms, reconfiguration of the existing main building to better use circulation space and provide additional classrooms and refurbishment of the existing Design & Technology block and kitchen/ Canteen to provide the students with modern vibrant learning and socialising spaces.

The main works include the demolition of the existing single story building and a new purpose built SEN building constructed in its place, a new modern and inviting glazed entrance foyer with new reception, refurbishment and reconfiguration of existing classrooms, chapel and dining areas including a new more modern and efficient kitchen.

The programme of works has been phased to allow sectional occupation of the newly refurbished areas of the school, meaning that the school will benefit from the use of the new areas as they finish rather than waiting until completion of the full project.

Completion is planned for April 2022.

### Considerate Constructors Scheme

Our site is registered with the Considerate Constructors Scheme (CCS).

The CCS is a non-profit independent organisation formed to help contractors build strong relationships with neighbours.

CCS will assess us regularly - we will let you know how we get on!



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## What's next on site?

This week will see the demolition of the single-story building & removal of the Tree to the West corner paving the way for the new SEN building.

Re-roofing of the main school building will commence this month and once complete the scaffolding will start to be removed.

Commencement of the new SEN building once the existing single-story structure has been demolished..

Commencement of refurbishing of the existing D & T block.

## Disruption Early Forecast Warnings

Deliveries to site will be ongoing throughout the project but these will be managed with pre-booking for all deliveries, strict delivery time windows and a strict 'No waiting to unload' policy to help minimize disruption.

The demolition process for the single-story building will emit a degree of noise, but Midas will ensure the disruption is kept as brief as possible

## Minimising Ecological Impact

The site has been thoroughly assessed by an ecologist, who has helped to create a plan that will protect and preserve the wildlife currently inhabiting the site. The plan includes:

- Adding bat and bird boxes to the new SEN building.
- The planting of new trees to replace the ones removed.
- At the end of the project the 2 story 'Devon Lady' building is to be demolished and the area landscaped.

## Architecture and Style

The scheme has been designed by a specialist local architecture firm, which has focused on a modern sleek and inviting yet functional upgrade of the existing structures.
