## Summer Results Analysis 2023

## Summary of information

- Our Progress and Attainment data at Key Stage 4 is significantly lower than where we want it to be but disruption to learning, particularly to our Year 11 students due to absence, has impacted upon this.

Below is a breakdown of how this affected their performance:

- Progress was strongest in French, PE, Media Studies, Art and Photography at Key Stage 4 with results well above the national average.
- In subjects where progress has been weakest, like Music and Food \& Nutrition, staffing issues have been a contributing factor. These have now been resolved with the recruitment of specialist teaching staff in these areas.
- In Key Stage 5, we are pleased to see an increase in students achieving 3 A-levels from $A^{*}-E$ and $A^{*}-C$. However, these percentages are reduced because we offer hybrid programmes at Key Stage 5 including vocational subjects so as to meet the needs of our students. The average grade for our vocational subjects was a Distinction.
- We have had a considerable number of Key Stage 4 students with EBSA (Emotional Based School Avoidance) developed as a result of the pandemic, who have not taken a full allocation of subject areas. We have also had a larger number of students joining us within Key Stage 4 including during Year 11 itself. All these students have been included in our data.
- Our EBacc percentage has been low due to the lack of recruitment into MFL, namely French. This is something that we have addressed within the options process and additional investment which has increased our numbers within this measure and they will continue to increase next year.
- Our destination data looks to remain an area of strength highlighting the excellent careers provision and our commitment to care for the individual.
